Sports uniforms may be worn on days when students have practical sports, dance, or physical education classes. If a student is out of uniform, they must bring a note from their parent/carer explaining the reason and obtain an out-of-uniform pass from their House Office at the start of the day. There are no specified times for switching between summer and winter uniforms, but generally, winter uniforms are worn in Terms Two and Three.

#### GENERAL UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

- **Shirts:** Must be tucked in neatly at the waist when not the outer garment
- Undergarments: Plain white T-shirts (optional) which must not be visible except at the neck (not long-sleeved)
- **Blazer:** Plain Geelong High School twill blazer (optional)
- Jacket: Official Geelong High School soft shell jacket may be worn as an outer garment with day-to-day uniform or sports uniform

# PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORT UNIFORM

- **Top:** Navy micro-mesh polo with school logo and house colour stripe
- **Bottoms:** Navy GHS micro-mesh sports shorts (unisex and female cut) or school tracksuit pants (unisex and female cut)
- **Footwear:** Appropriate sports shoes with non-marking soles
- Socks: White

Note: When representing the school in interschool sports, students must wear their sports uniform.

#### **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

- **Hair:** Must be tidy, natural in colour, clean, and worn in a manner that does not interfere with school activities. Hair accessories should align with school colours.
- Hats & Sunglasses: Not to be worn inside school buildings. Geelong High School logo baseball caps and beanies are acceptable. Caps or beanies with other logos are not acceptable.
- Jewellery: Must be gold or silver, unobtrusive, and discreet. Students may wear a maximum of two small sleepers/studs per ear, one necklace, one watch, one ring, and/or one bangle. One small clear plastic stud nose piercing is permitted. Facial piercings and other jewellery are not permitted. Staff may require the removal of jewellery for safety purposes.
- Makeup: A minimal amount is acceptable.

#### **CANTEEN LUNCH ORDERS**


The current canteen price list can be found on the school website.

## **Communication** Between School and Home

### COMPASS

Open and effective communication is the key to a successful school community. Compass is a school management system that allows parents and carers to access up-to-date and meaningful information about Geelong High School and your child's progress. A copy of the Compass Parent Guide can be found on the school website at www.geelonghigh.vic.edu.au/about-us/schooladministration/general-school-information.

Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance and enter an explanation for absence or lateness.
- Communicate with your child's teachers and update your family contact details.
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar.
- Monitor your child's academic progress.
- Download and view your child's academic reports.
- Book parent-teacher conferences.
- Pay and provide consent for events and school fees.

#### COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER AND FACEBOOK

#### **STUDENT DIARY**

Students are strongly encouraged to use the Geelong High School student diary in all lessons. Students should use their diaries to record their homework, the dates of activities they are involved in, and tasks they need to do to stay organised and engaged at school. It includes a study timetable where they can map out when they intend to complete their homework. The diary also includes the class leave pass. If a student needs to leave the classroom, they must have their diary with the note from the teacher in it.

#### APPOINTMENTS DURING SCHOOL HOURS

If it is necessary to attend a medical or other appointment during the school day, parents must enter a note on Compass no later than 10:30am. Parents/carers are encouraged to log onto Compass and enter the student's absences themselves before calling the Administration Office for assistance. Students should arrange to meet their parent/carer at the Administration Office when leaving for an appointment, report back to the Administration Office on their return, and use the Compass Kiosk to sign in with their ID card. Please try to arrange appointments outside of school hours.

### ABSENCES

"It's not OK to stay away." The importance of attendance cannot be overstated. The fewer days absent, the better. Absences are recorded via the Compass Parent Portal. Please refer to the Compass manual on our website.

#### STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARDS

The Student ID Card enables students to access the COMPASS Kiosk for late arrival/early departure passes and to check their timetable. If lost, a replacement card can be ordered through the Administration Office at a cost of \$10. Students must carry Identity Cards at all times.

### **OUT OF UNIFORM**

When unable to wear the full school uniform, a note from a parent or carer explaining the circumstances must be given to your House Leader before school for the issuance of a Uniform Pass. This pass must be carried for the full time you are out of uniform and shown to a teacher when requested. Failure to be in uniform will result in an after-school detention if the student hasn't collected a note from the House Office.

#### **ACCELERATED LEARNING PROGRAM**

Geelong High School offers an Accelerated Program from Year 7-9 and continues the current options for students to accelerate from Year 10-12, open to all students. This program is for students who are looking for extra challenge and who are motivated and engaged learners wishing to be part of a program for like-minded students.

Some key characteristics of our ALP program are:

- Acceleration in the core subjects of Maths, English, Science, and Humanities from Year 7
- More higher-order thinking •
- Less repetition of content
- Faster curriculum progression
- Opportunities for acceleration into the Senior Years
- A wide range of extracurricular extension opportunities •
- A focus on deep learning and academic enrichment •

Students who are not part of the ALP program in Year 7 will still have the opportunity to accelerate later in their schooling through our regular acceleration program offered to students from Year 9. Please see our Course Handbooks available on our website for more information.

#### EXTRA CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

Geelong High School offers a wide range of extracurricular programs, and students are encouraged to get involved wherever possible. They can take part in debating, Model United Nations, Social Innovators Leadership program, World Scholars Cup, our peripatetic music tuition program, bands, our orchestra, the school production, a myriad of competitive interschool sporting teams and experiences, student leadership training and opportunities, ICAS assessment competitions, a wide range of lunchtime clubs, the Australian Mathematics Competition, and activities such as chess club, manga anime club, and more.

### **SCHOOL PRODUCTION**

Each year, the school presents a large-scale musical performed to sell-out crowds. Students in all year levels are welcome to join the production in either a performance or backstage role. This extracurricular activity not only builds students' capacity to perform but also develops skills in teamwork, organisation, and leadership. The performance season takes place in July in our very own Shenton Theatre.

#### **MUSIC DEPARTMENT**

The Music Department at Geelong High School has been busy building a musical and educational hub that brings together an extensive range of musical opportunities for your student. A variety of tuition is offered at Geelong High School, including woodwind, brass, percussion, string, and voice lessons.

#### **EXCURSIONS AND ACTIVITIES**

Geelong High School strives to minimise the cost of excursions. The number of excursions offered varies from year to year, and the cost of planned activities will differ between units. Students participating in interschool sports outside the Geelong Region, the Band, or the Musical Production may incur additional travel costs.



## Health and Wellbeing

### **MEDICATION**

The school does not provide paracetamol. Paracetamol may either be held by the student or kept at the Administration Office. It cannot be administered by staff without written consent.

### **SICK BAY**

Students who are unwell should stay at home. If you receive a phone call from the Administration Office, you must collect your child. Students should not contact their parents directly; they must report to the Administration Office, where staff will contact parents or guardians. Please ensure that emergency contact details are up to date.

### **DESIGNATED YEAR 7 AREA**


Our Year 7 students have a designated play area reserved exclusively for Year 7 students. This area is located next to the CJ Love Hall and features basketball courts, seating, trees, downball courts, lockers, and drink taps. It is also close to the House Offices, Year 7 classrooms, library, and canteen. This space provides a safe base for Year 7 students as they transition into high school. Year 7 students may also choose to play in other areas of the school if they wish.

#### **WELLBEING TEAM**

At our school, the Wellbeing Team is dedicated to supporting the holistic needs of our students. This team, led by an Assistant Principal, includes social workers, an occupational therapist, and a psychologist. Additionally, our Doctors in Schools Service features a doctor and a nurse who are available to assist students. We also have a general practitioner available on-site once a week. Our team works closely with community organisations to ensure comprehensive support for both students and their families.

### **INCLUSION TEAM**

Our Inclusion Team is committed to an inclusive education model, ensuring that every student engages with the established curriculum. Individual programs are designed only when necessary to meet specific learning goals. The team focuses on maximising each student's educational potential and ensuring that those with additional learning needs are supported and valued in all aspects of school life, aligned with their personal goals and aspirations.





### **Student** Possessions

#### VALUABLES

Students should avoid bringing valuable items or large sums of money to school. If necessary, leave these items at the Administration Office for safekeeping and collect them after school.

#### LOST PROPERTY

Named items are returned to students whenever possible. Unnamed items are kept for one term and are then donated to Wellbeing. Lost property can be found at the Administration Office.

#### **MOBILE PHONES**

Geelong High School adheres to the Education Minister's policy, which requires that students who bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during the school day. #### **COMBINATION LOCK**

Each Year 7 student is assigned a locker for personal use. We strongly recommend purchasing a combination lock to secure belongings. The locks, available for \$20, come with a personal three-part combination registered with the Administration Office for backup. These high-quality locks are durable and designed to last throughout a student's high school years.

- Details: This excursion provides Year 7 students with the opportunity to enjoy beach activities, including surfing, body surfing, beach awareness activities, flag races, and sandcastle competitions. It's a great chance for students to get to know their classmates and house leaders before the term and school year begin. Parents/carers will be asked to consent via Compass when access is available in early December.

#### Year 7 Camp 2025

- Starting 28th April 2025 (Date TBC)
- Location: Alexandra Adventure Resort
- Details: A three-day camp as part of the Year 7 curriculum. The camp aims to help students build relationships with peers and teachers in a supportive and challenging environment away from school. Activities will include high ropes, a flying fox, a rock climbing wall, canoeing, a flying possum glider, archery, raft building, and orienteering. These activities will develop practical skills in an outdoor setting and emphasise cooperation and understanding of others.





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
